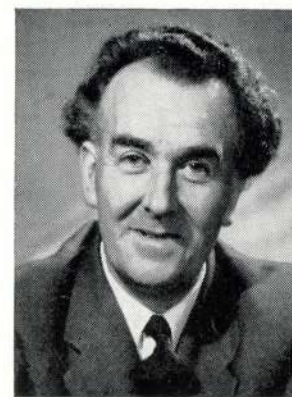

"CARNIVAL" (Helen Perkin)

(Published by R. Smith & Co. Ltd., 210 Strand, London, W.C.2)

SYNOPSIS :

Miss Helen Perkin's Carnival Suite is in three movements — Cavalcade, Pavane and Burlesque — titles which immediately conjure up a host of pictures in the imaginative mind. The Cavalcade, not so easy to play as would first appear, is followed by the grave yet not over emotional Pavane. The final movement, the Burlesque, is hearty and markedly rhythmic and the whole piece poses some interesting technical problems before the suite comes to its brilliant close.

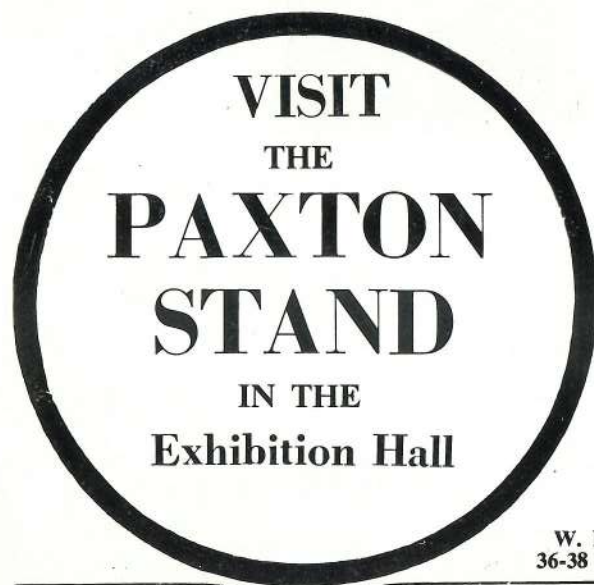

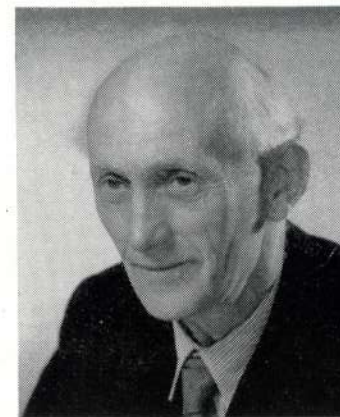

"SUITE ANCIENNE" (Alfred Ashpole)

(Published by Messrs. R. Smith & Co., Ltd., 210 Strand, London, W.C.2.)

SYNOPSIS :

As the title implies here is music in "period" style; not deeply emotional, but having admirable clarity, and is even "Aristocratic" in atmosphere.

There are four movements. 1, Prelude, sets the scene in flowing, even sturdy phrases; 2, Sarabande, is as Shakespeare described this dance-form — "A measure full of state and ancientry;" 3, Gavotte, has its own characteristic delicacy; 4, Jig, is a six-eight movement, gay and rhythmic, with a short, but effective "grandioso" coda.

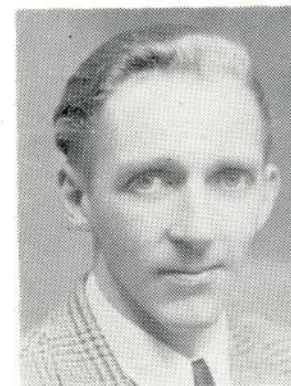

"THREE CHARACTERISTIC PIECES" (Adam Carse)

Published by Messrs. Boosey & Hawkes, 295 Regent Street, London, W.1.)

SYNOPSIS :

The three movements Prelude, Minuet and Rustic Dance, while varied in tempo and style, have a unity rarely found in light-music suites. This is achieved to a large extent by the frequent recurrence throughout of one short melodic figure or its inversion and by the harmonic idiom. There is also a skilful and economic use of material — a point which student-composers would do well to study.

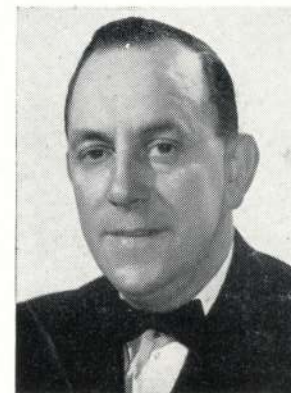

SYNOPSIS :

Drake Rimmer in arranging this well-known piece by Weber has produced a worthy test for anyone. The broad treatment of the first movement is followed by the Allegro Vivace which calls for absolute clarity. Quite a different mood and style is necessary in the Poco meno mosso where flexibility of tempo is very much to be desired.

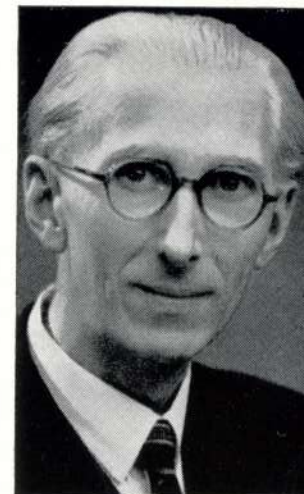

The music of "Glastonbury" could be regarded as a continuation of the composer's well-known "Tintagel." There is no attempt in either work to make sound pictures and the composer hopes that without looking for a story behind the music, this Overture will be enjoyed for its own sake.
